What an awesome time I had aboard ship. I had all the luxuries and food you could imagine. Then I stepped off the ship in Roatan Island, Honduras. We were greeted at the port by joyful singers and dancers looking for us to drop some money into their box. That is one way they have to make a living.

We walked past the shops and out through the gated fence that protected us. We walked down the main street for about three blocks. The streets were muddy and coarse. There were armed guards, with rifles drawn, at the door of the bank. As we walked a young boy decided to join us, so he could get some money. We walked and talked with him for a little while, then one member of our group gave

him \$5.00 and sent him on his way to meet some more people from the cruise ship (the

ones with money). On the days the cruise ships arrive, the children are released from school early, so they can be "tour guides".

We stopped at a shop called "Made in Roatan", that is run by missionaries.

Pastor Sharon had told us about the shop. The local people make their crafts and the money goes back to them when their items are sold. Needless to say, I started spending money. Among other things I bought a book titled, "The

Darker Side of Paradise". It is the story of Carolina Brooks, born and raised in Roatan. Carolina is a woman of great faith amidst a life of suffering.

In retrospect, when I look at my life in contrast to what I saw, I am rich by comparison.
